**THE BLUE WAVE IN WHITE PLAINS** – We all experienced the *unusually large* turnout in the general election on November 6 when we went to the polls. And the results here in White Plains were overwhelmingly **blue**. The unofficial results in the race for Governor show the magnitude of the Democratic tide in White Plains. Including votes cast on minor-party lines, Governor Andrew Cuomo received **13,811** votes citywide, while GOP nominee Marc Molinaro (the County Executive of Dutchess County) received **4,716** votes citywide, and other candidates received a combined total of **508** votes citywide. In percentage terms, Cuomo won **72.6%** of the vote citywide, winning every election district decisively.
